

REMIND: An Investigator Initiated Study Testing the Feasibility of Maintenance Radiotherapy for Patients with Newly Diagnosed Glioblastoma

Eligibility Criteria

Sex: Male or Female

Age Group: 18 years and over

This study is NOT accepting healthy volunteers

Inclusion Criteria:

- 18 years of age or older - newly diagnosed with glioblastoma (GBM) and planning to receive standard treatment, including surgery, radiation therapy, and temozolomide (TMZ)

Exclusion Criteria:

- currently pregnant or breastfeeding - cancer involves the brainstem within the area planned for radiation - previous radiation therapy to the brain - unable to safely have MRI or CT scans

Description: This study is testing whether a single additional treatment of radiation therapy, called maintenance radiotherapy, is safe and feasible for adults who have recently been diagnosed with glioblastoma (GBM). Participants will first receive their usual treatment for GBM, including surgery, radiation therapy, and the chemotherapy drug temozolomide. About one month after completing standard radiation therapy, participants will receive one additional treatment of radiation therapy. The study will also look at changes in certain immune cells before and after the additional radiation treatment. Participants will continue their usual follow-up care every 2 to 4 months for up to 5 years after the additional treatment.

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
