

A Randomized Phase III Study of Systemic Therapy With or Without Hepatic Arterial Infusion for Unresectable Colorectal Liver Metastases: The PUMP Trial EA2222

Eligibility Criteria

Sex: Male or Female

Age Group: 18 years and over

This study is NOT accepting healthy volunteers

Inclusion Criteria:

- age 18 or older - diagnosed with colorectal cancer that has spread to the liver, cannot be removed by surgery, and has not been found outside the liver - received about 3-6 months of first-line chemotherapy and have cancer that is stable or responding to treatment - see link to clinicaltrials.gov for complete inclusion criteria

Exclusion Criteria:

- have previously received certain treatments directed at the liver, such as radiation or hepatic artery infusion therapy - have cirrhosis or portal hypertension - are pregnant or breastfeeding - see link to clinicaltrials.gov for complete exclusion criteria
